

6th Year Peer Review of Teaching Summary of: Iason Elsinger, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics

Committee: Roxanne Back, Susan Serrano, and Brian Hamilton

Observations: November 11th and 17th, 2022

Courses: MAT2505 Linear Algebra and MAT2311 Calculus I

November 29th, 2022

Classroom Observation:

The committee's teaching schedules prevented us from observing the same course. On November 11th, Dr. Hamilton observed MAT2505 Linear Algebra. On November 17th, Dr. Back and Dr. Serrano observed MAT2311 Calculus I. Although the courses were different, we all conclude that Dr. Elsinger is an excellent instructor. This is evident by the rapport he has built with the students, his enthusiasm for the content, and the engagement in the classroom. The ratings on the Classroom Observation form were scored "exceptional" across all categories.

Dr. Elsinger's comfort in front of the classroom, carefully chosen examples, and clear explanations demonstrate a command of the subject. Dr. Hamilton writes: "Dr. Elsinger shows an easy mastery of material – walking slowly through difficult problems, explaining steps, inventing new problems to address specific questions, etc."

Dr. Elsinger has created an environment where students feel comfortable and are encouraged to ask questions. The committee notes that students freely asked questions throughout the class period and he often "checked in" with students collectively as a class and individually during independent practice.

Students were engaged throughout the class period by the variation of explanations of new concepts followed by group and individual practice. Dr. Elsinger did an excellent job of choosing examples that are relevant and interesting to the students. In Calculus, the examples on blood pressure connected what they were learning in class to real life. He challenged students to think at higher levels by asking probing questions beyond calculus and asking students to apply their knowledge from other disciplines.

Review of Course Material:

The majority of scores in regard to course materials were marked as satisfactory across all categories.

Dr. Elsinger takes great care in preparing his materials for class. One committee member writes: "The organization of the course is meticulous and extremely well communicated to students. Every part of the course is mapped to a particular outcome." The syllabus, handouts, assessments, and Canvas page are all detailed, organized, and appropriate for the course level. The mastery based grading system links every assignment and assessment to the student learning outcomes and course objectives.

Overall Findings:

Dr. Elsinger is a master teacher. He clearly cares about the students' learning experience which is evident in the time and effort he takes to prepare his lessons and materials for class. Dr. Elsinger focuses on teaching concepts, not just algorithms, and connects the material to other disciplines.

The committee finds that Dr. Elsinger's outstanding teaching contributes significantly to the academic climate in the Department of Mathematics and Florida Southern College.
